### Squirrel Diggings

Squirrels cache seeds by burying them. Can you find the excavation site they leave behind after retrieving their snack?



### Great Egret

These large white birds can be spotted wading in water. Try to find one.



### Shelf Fungi

Can you find a shelf fungus high in a tree? Now is the time to look before the leaves come.



### Chorus Frog

Chorus frogs are singing their spring songs. Can you hear what they have to say?



### Common Goldeneye Whistle

This species calls the Lower Peninsula of Michigan their winter home. Now that spring is here they will be making their way north for breeding. Listen for the whistling sound their wings make as they fly.



### Painted Turtle

On a sunny day try finding a painted turtle basking on a log.



### Beaver Chews

Beavers chew on tree trunks to keep their teeth worn down. Can you find an area where beavers have been busy?



### Pileated Woodpecker Hole

Pileated Woodpeckers create large rectangular holes in trees. Try finding one. It is common to see their handy work on dead trees.



### Eastern Hemlock Cones

This ancient species is long lived and slow growing. Their precious seeds are housed in small cones. Walk through a stand of hemlocks and see how many cones you can find.
