### Yellow-rumped Warbler

This species is among the first warblers you will see in spring. Look high in the tree tops to spot one.



### American Mink

Mink are tiny but fierce predators that spend much of their time near bodies of water searching for food. Head to a river or pond to spot a mink.



### Golden-crowned Kinglet

Walk through a forest to find this small bird quickly flying branch to branch. Try to spot its crown with yellow-orange coloring.



### Muskrat Scat

Muskrat scat can be found on rocks and logs near water. Look for the scat and see if you can tell what it has been eating. Muskrats can have transmittable parasites. Do not handle scat.



### Gosling

Young geese are beginning to emerge from their nests. Can you spot the bundles of joy following their parents?



### Bee

Even though the temperatures are fluctuating, the bees are busy doing their job of pollinating the spring flowers. See if you can find one hard at work. What species is it?



### Virginia Bluebells

The young leaves sprouting from the ground are deep blue-purple for this plant. As it grows the leaves turn green. Find a one. What color variation do you see?



### Wilson's Snipe

This species prefers to be near wet, marshy areas. Watch a Wilson's Snipe performing a winnow display. This display is practiced to attract females and defend territories.
